This report analyzes the \$195 million raised in the 2002 election cycle by all 433 major-party candidates for every statewide* and legislative office in Texas. Contributions to the two major political party committees--most of which are spent in support of the candidates--are analyzed separately at the end of this report to avoid double-counting the same dollars as they move through the political system.

The contribution data presented here come from "Contribution & Expenditure" reports that all candidates and political action committees (PACs) must file with the Texas Ethics Commission. While most of these reports were filed in an electronic format, researchers entered some reports that were just filed on paper into an electronic database to facilitate computer analysis of the data (see "Luddite Fundraisers"). This report--which analyzes more than 145,000 contribution records--does not include contributions of less than \$100.

TPJ enhanced Texas Ethics Commission data by standardizing contributor names and attempting to identify the primary economic interest of every major individual and institutional (PAC or business) donor. Researchers identified the economic interest of 76 percent of the money analyzed in this report.

Dominated by failed gubernatorial candidate Tony Sanchez and successful lieutenant governor candidate David Dewhurst, a minority of Texas candidates self-financed some portion of their campaigns. When listing how much money each candidate raised, this report generally includes these self-financed contributions. When analyzing contribution sources, however, self-financing is left out to avoid skewed results. Since it is no secret that Sanchez and Dewhurst made their fortunes in the energy industry, for example, this report focuses on analyzing the sources of the money that they raised from other donors.

Because this report just analyzes political funds disclosed to the Texas Ethics Commission, it excludes the highly controversial \$1.9 million that the Texas Association of Business spent in 2002 to benefit 23 Republican legislative candidates. At press time, the Travis County District Attorney was investigating the legality of these stealth political expenditures.

* Texas candidates run for nine statewide offices: Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Comptroller, Land Commissioner, Railroad Commissioner, Agriculture Commissioner, Supreme Court and Court of Criminal Appeals.



MEET THE CANDIDATES

In 2002, Texans elected 523 officers to state government. Of 1,044 candidates who ran, 337 Republicans and 186 Democrats won offices. The following table breaks down the candidates who ran for each of these offices. The rest of this report analyzes the money raised only by candidates for 196 statewide executive, statewide judicial (Supreme Court and Court of Criminal Appeals), and legislative offices.

UNCONTESTED RACES

While both of the major parties each fielded at least one candidate for every statewide race in Texas, the winners of most district-based offices around the state faced no partisan competition whatsoever.

LUDDITE FUNDRAISERS

In 1999, the Texas Legislature enacted a campaign disclosure law requiring most political candidates and PACs to file contribution and expenditure reports in an electronic format beginning in 2000. These data are subsequently posted on the Internet, making them vastly more accessible than previous paper filings. However, the law contained two major loopholes. Candidates filing affidavits claiming they did not intend to raise or spend more than \$20,000 per year, or claiming they or their agents did not track donors on computers were exempt from the electronic filing requirement. Using these loopholes, 234 candidates and PACs avoided electronic disclosure of nearly \$8 million dollars in political contributions between January 2001 and July 2002. TPJ explored these loopholes more fully in our October, 2002 report entitled "Luddite PACs & Candidates."*

SELF-FINANCED CANDIDATES

Led by failed gubernatorial candidate Tony Sanchez, 47 candidates partially financed their own campaigns in amounts ranging from \$100 to almost \$57 million.

TEXAS CANDIDATES BORROWED \$47 MILLION IN 2002

Tony Sanchez (\$22.3 million) and David Dewhurst (\$13 million) borrowed 75% of all the money loaned to political campaigns in the 2002 cycle. Eighty-two percent of all political loans (\$38.6 million) were financed by the candidates themselves, often with a candidate's personal property used as collateral.

Total Raised By Major Party Statewide And Legislative Candidates In The 2002 Elections: \$195,079,871*

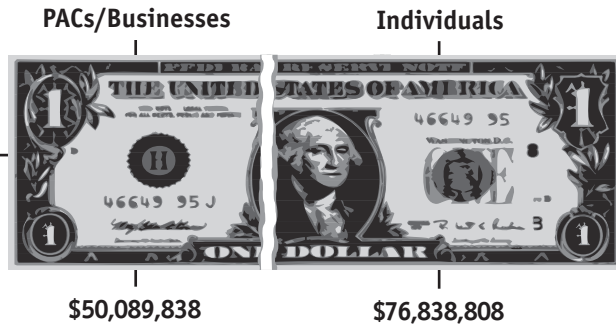

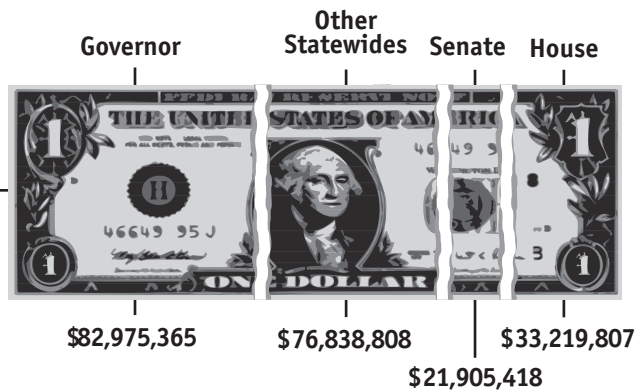

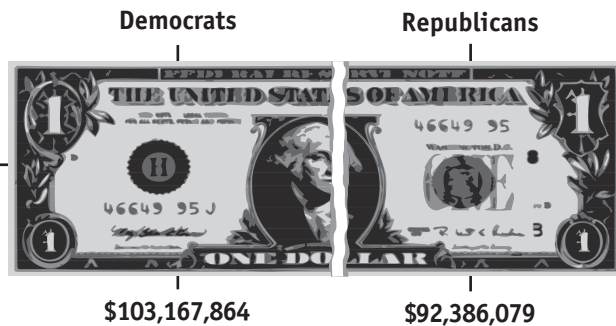

By Office

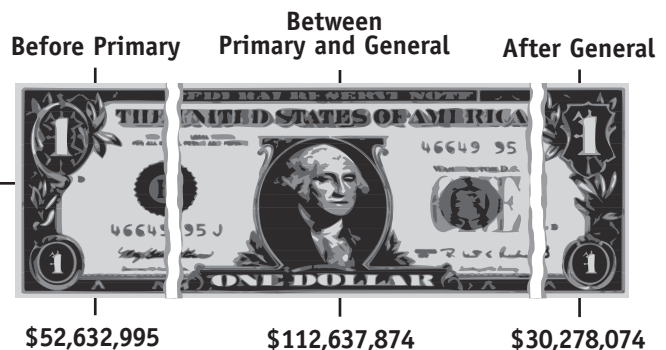


By Party



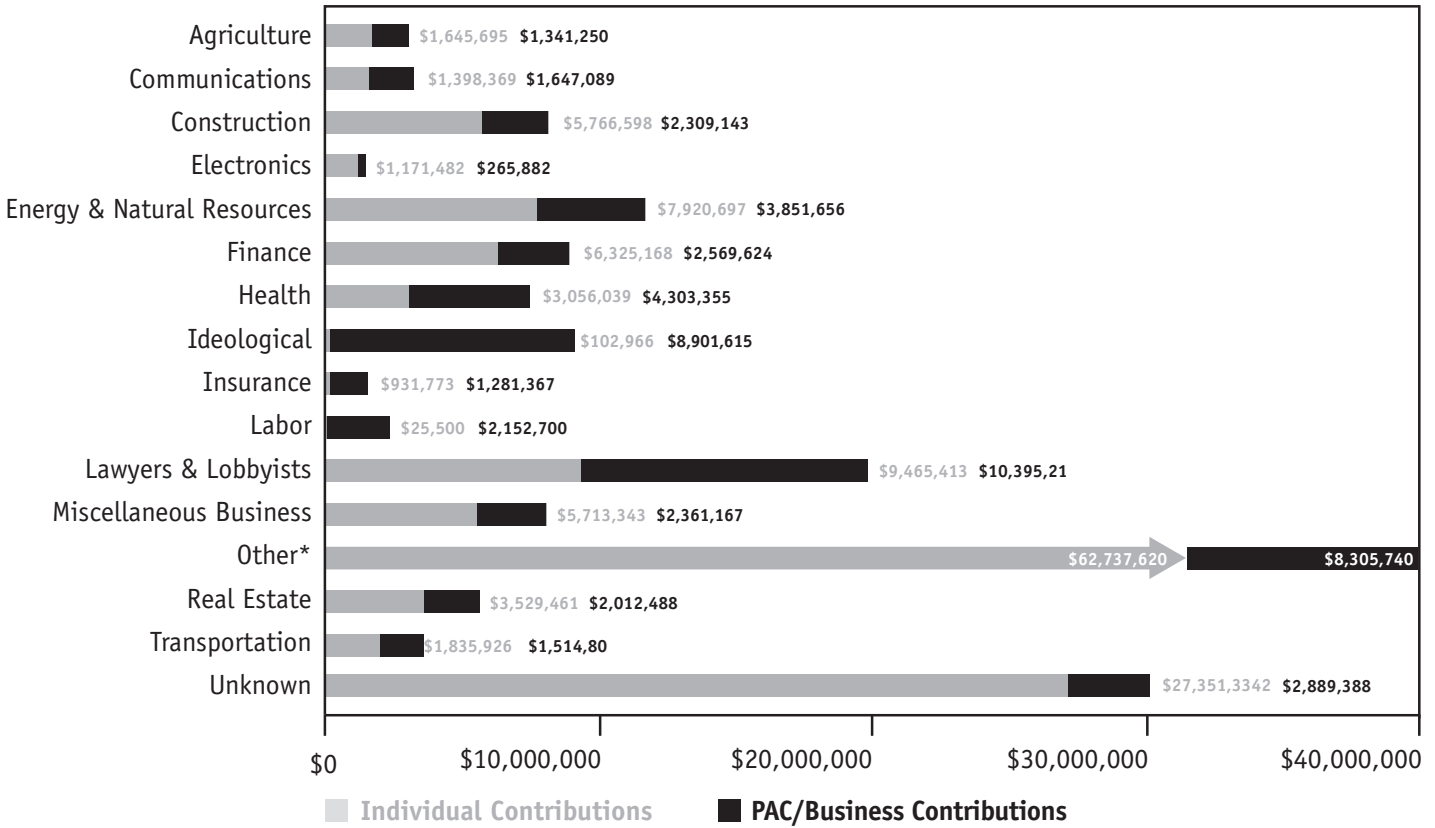
Primary vs. General

Total Raised by All Candidates (whether or not they had a primary)

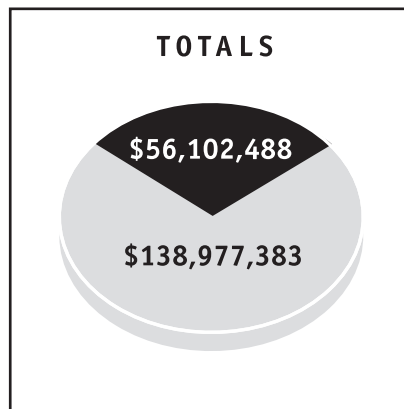

Over 58,000 donors (individuals, PAC's and businesses) contributed the \$126,926,647 raised by Texas candidates. Nearly one-half of the total amount contributed came from just 382 distinct donors, with 15 of those donors giving \$500,000 or more.

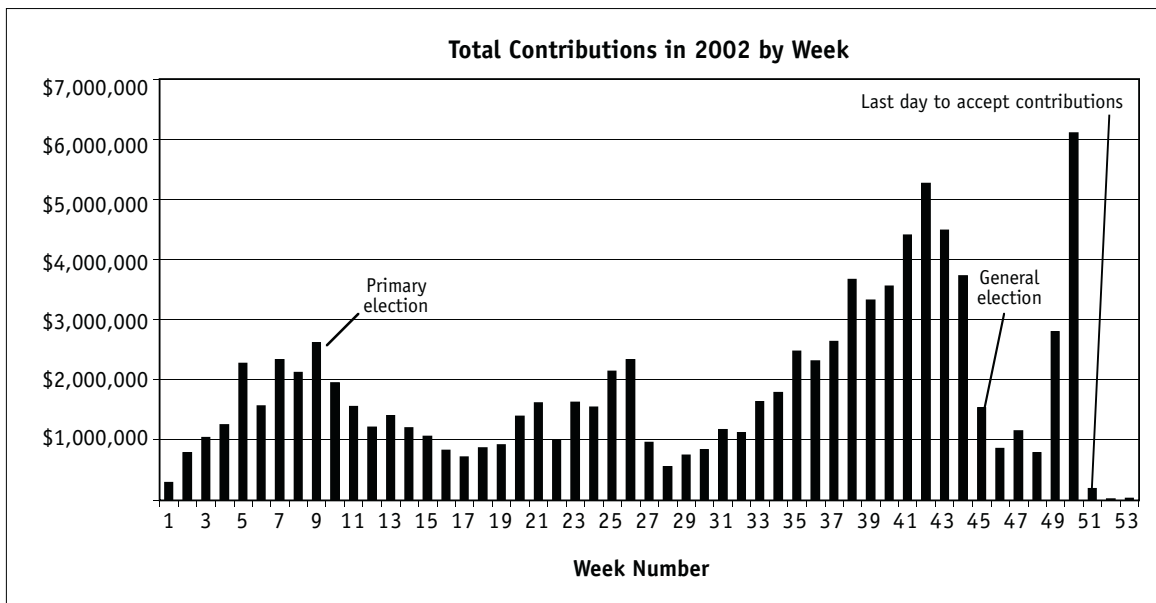
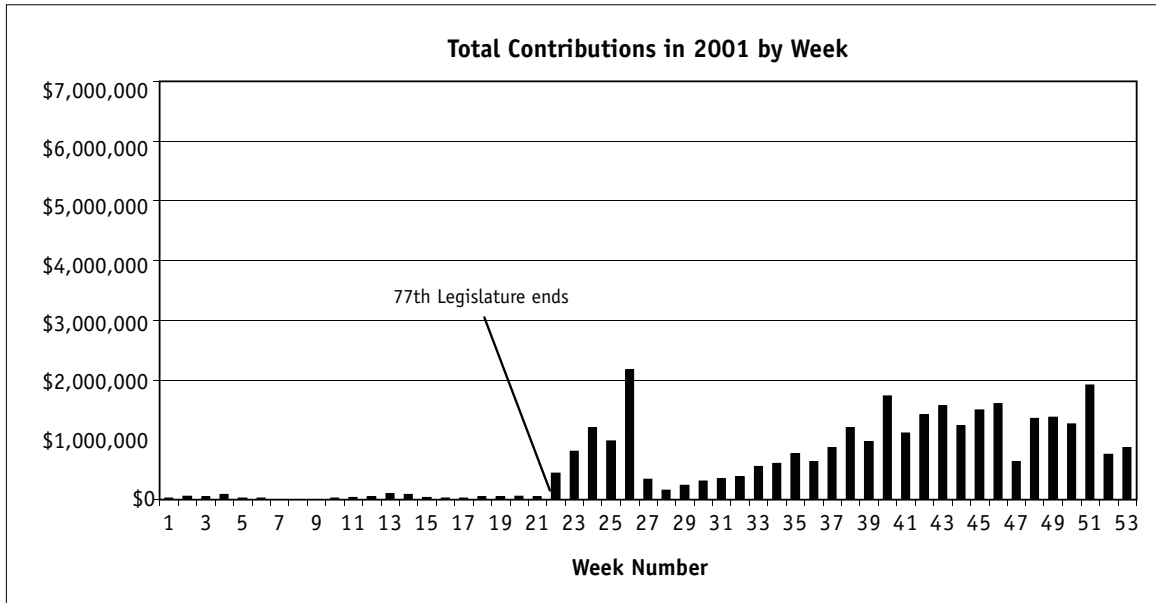

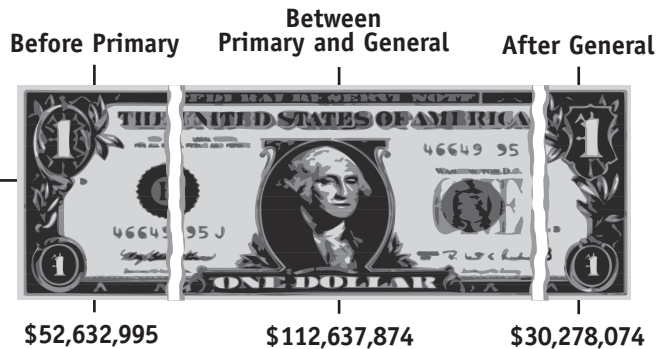
CONTRIBUTIONS BY TIME

Money By Week

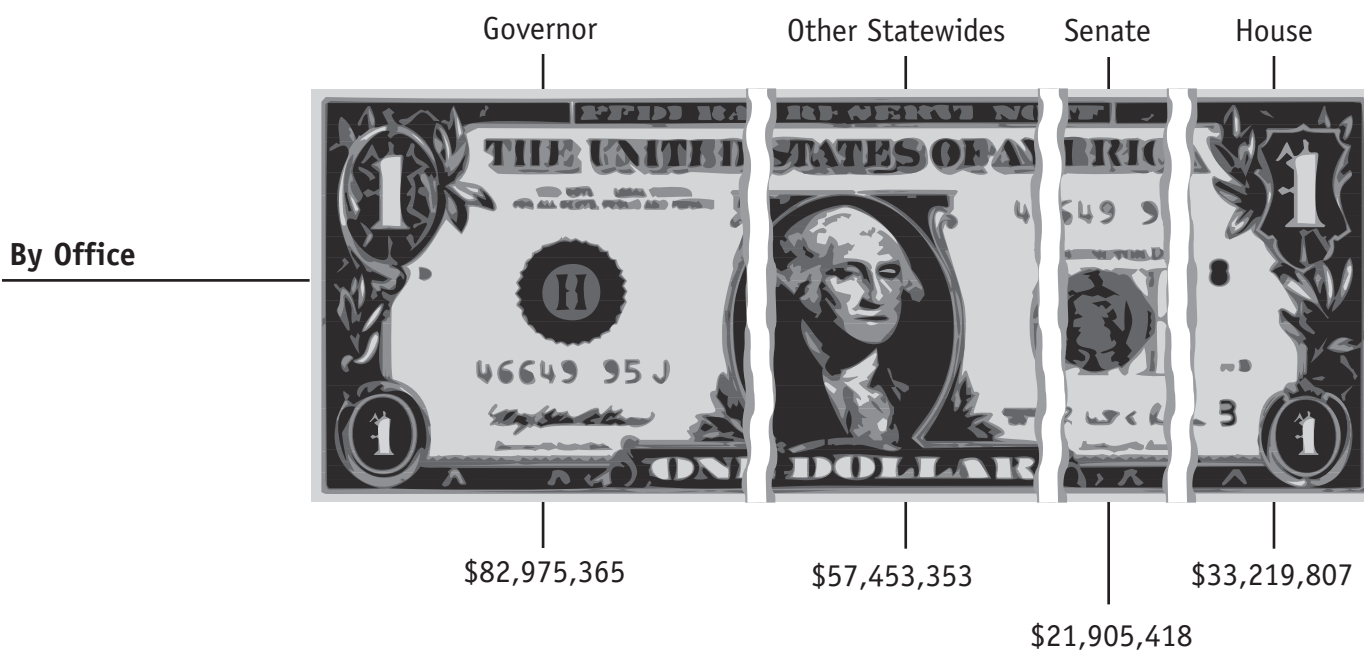


Primary v. General

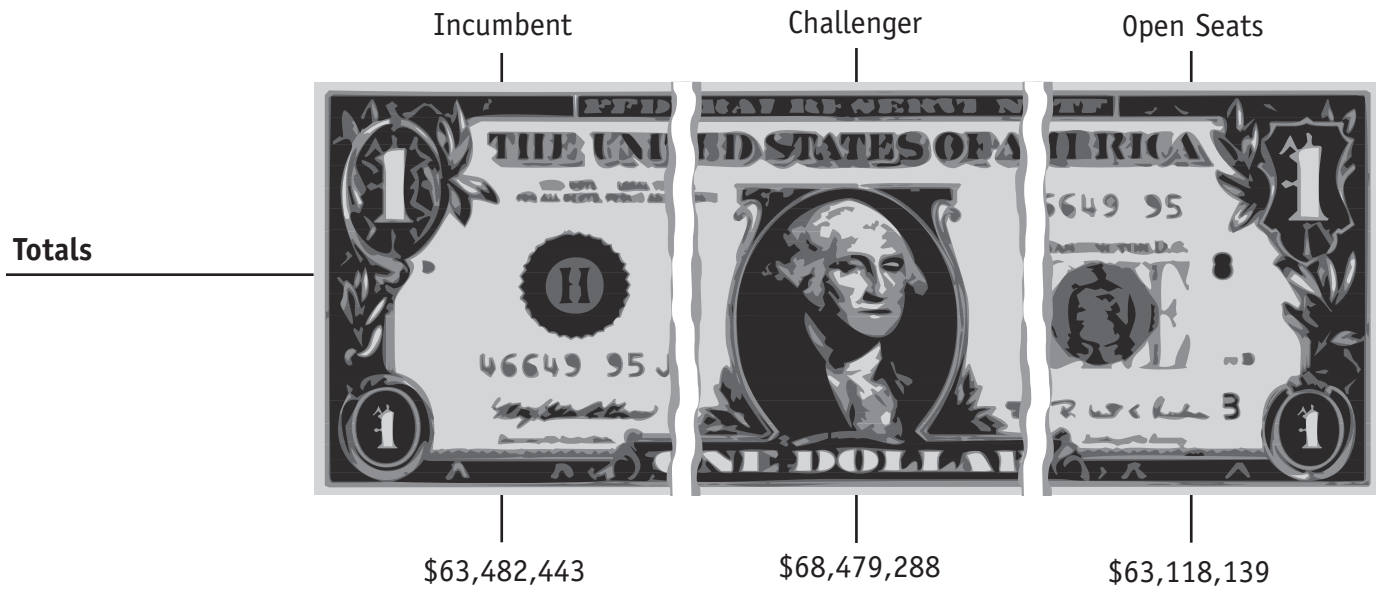

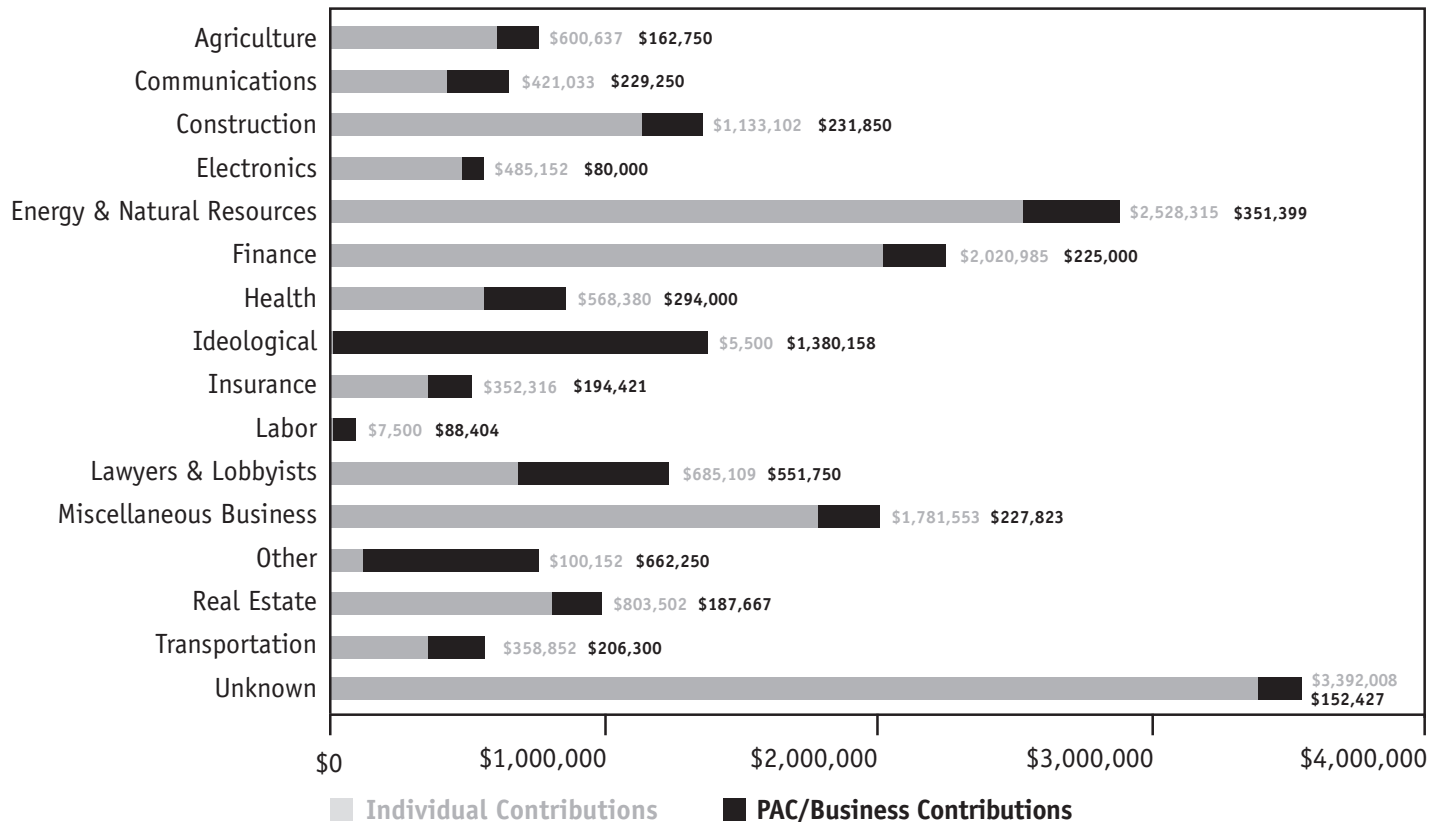

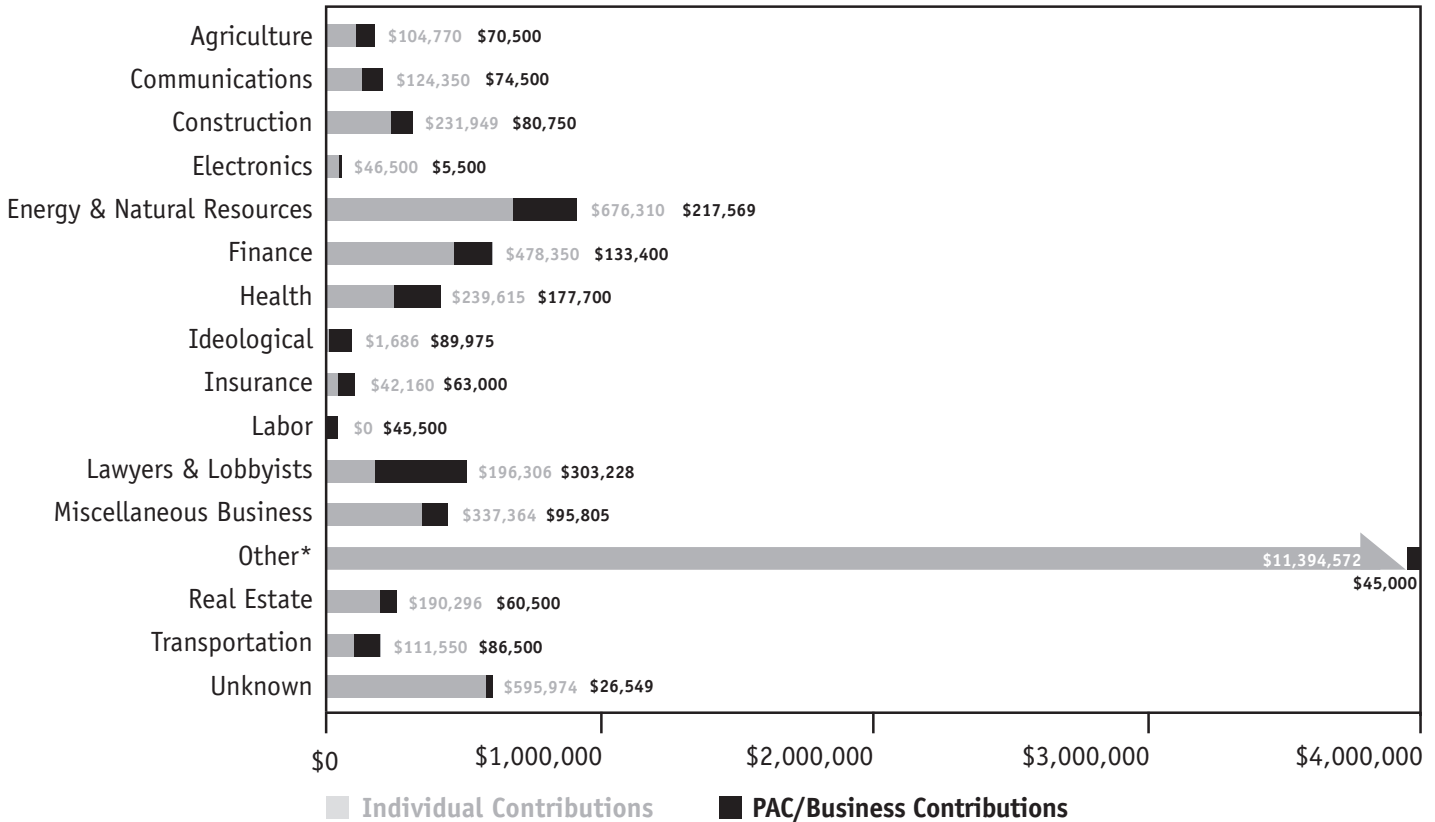

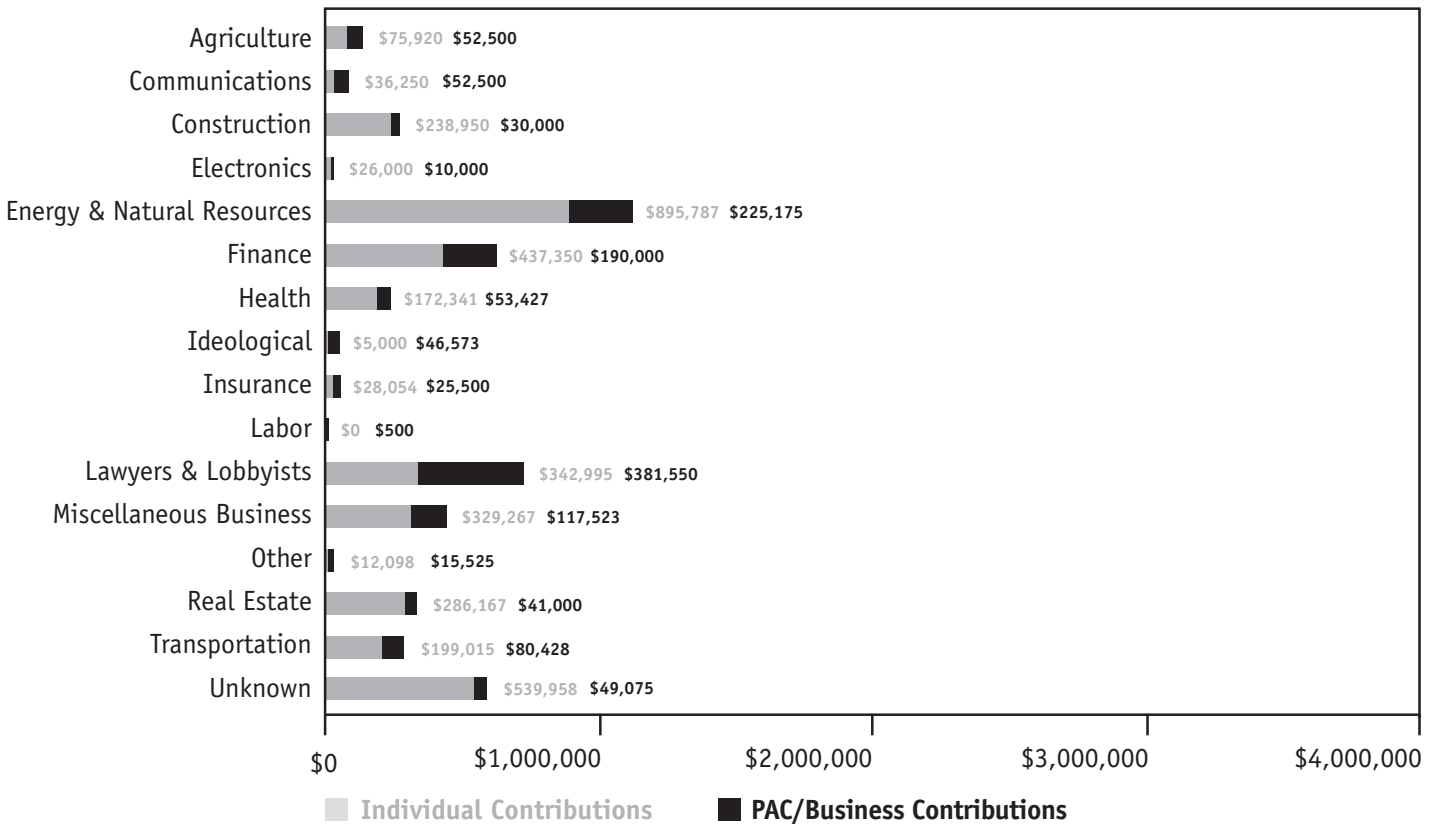

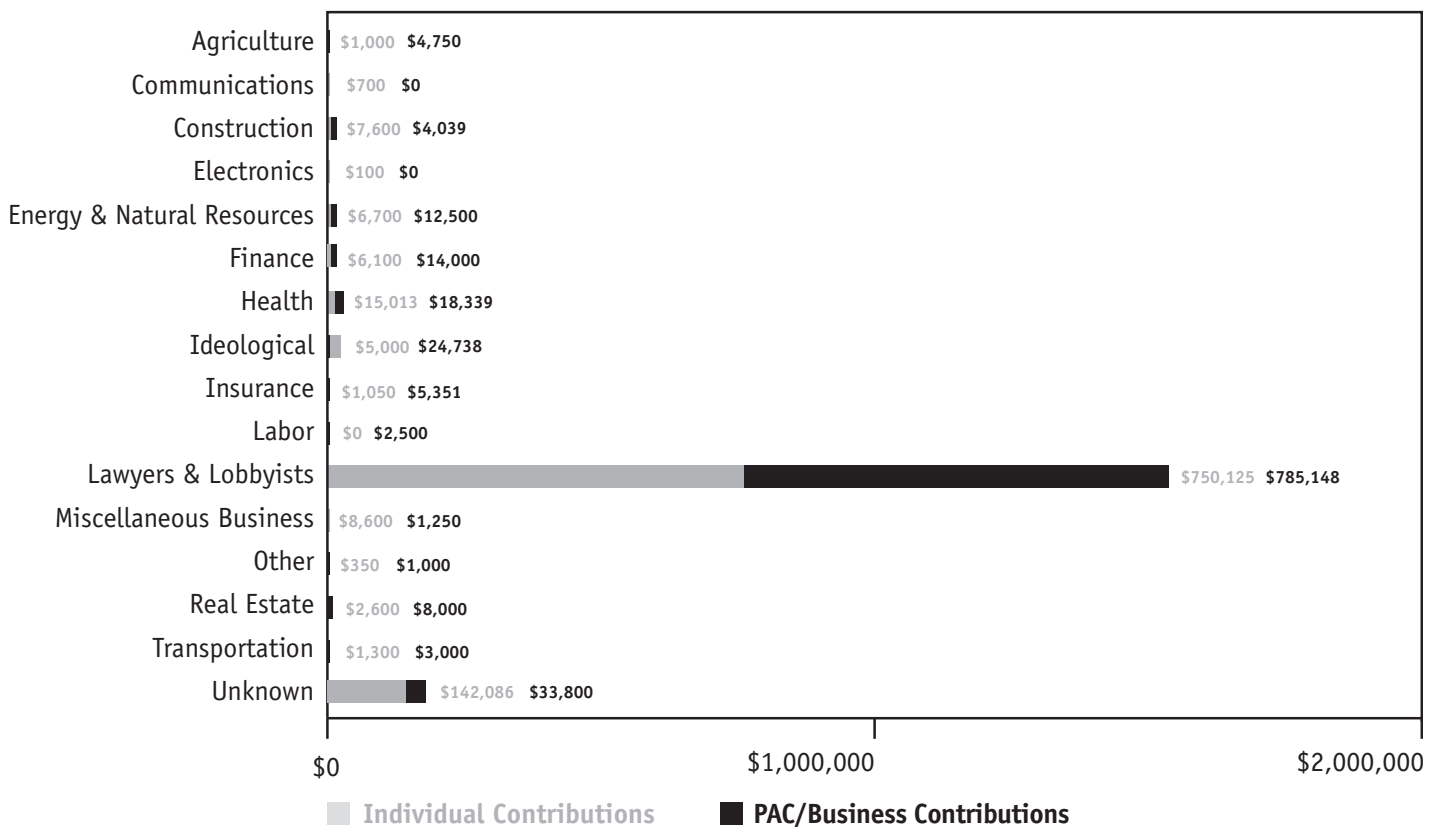

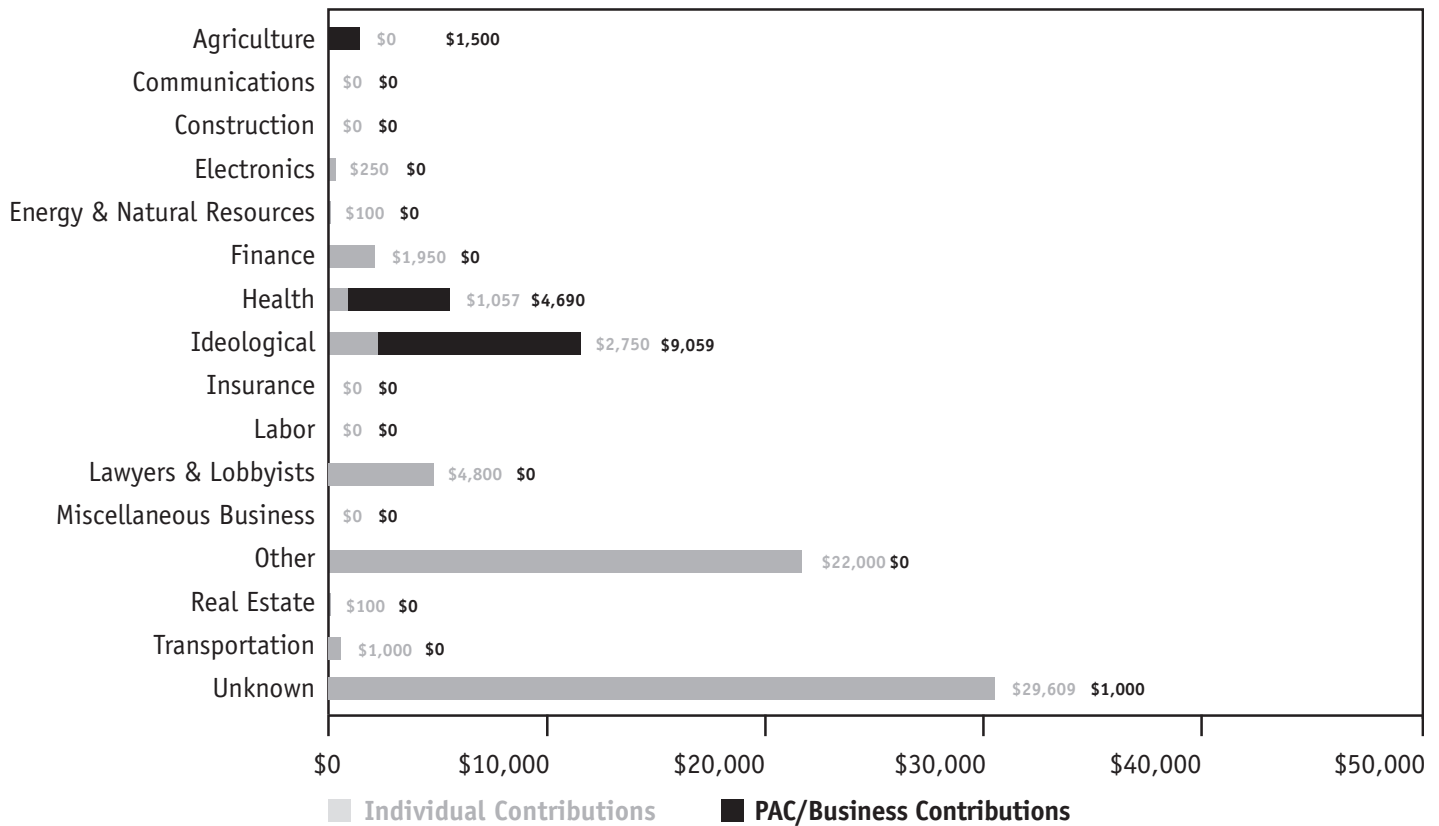

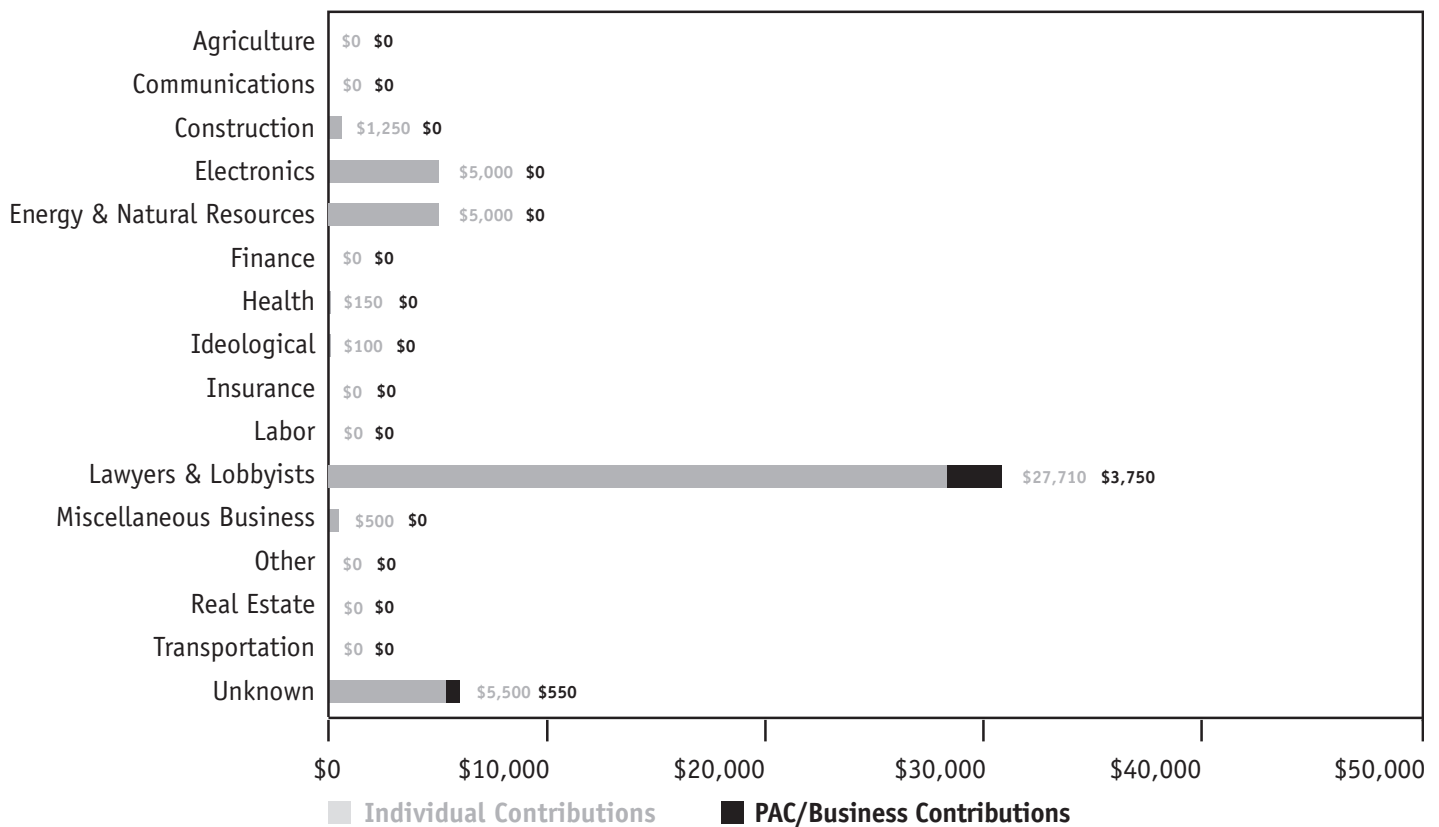

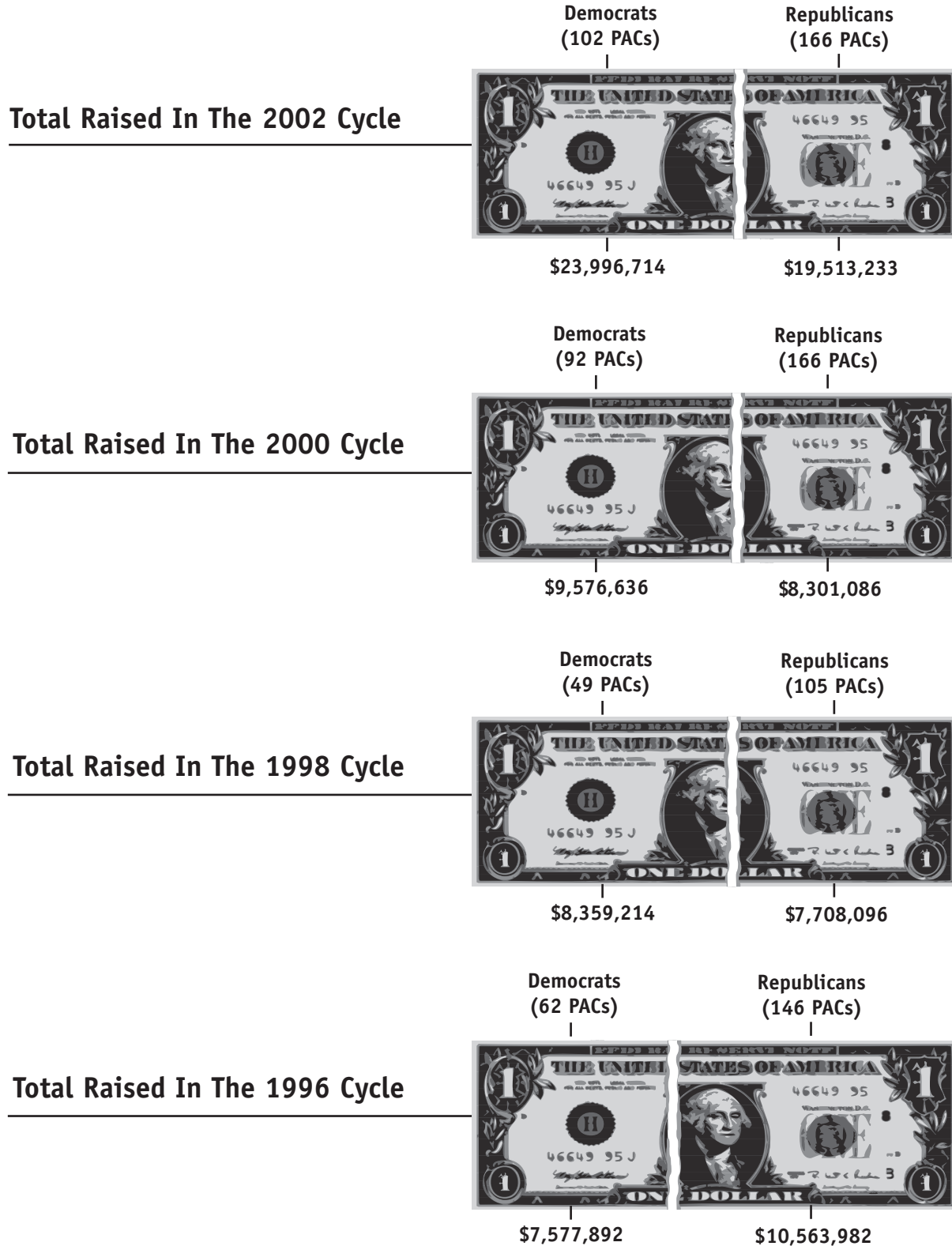




THE POLITICAL PARTIES

At any given moment, Texas Republicans control approximately 170 registered state PACs, and the Democrats 100 more. The vast majority of these are small, local entities, usually county executive committees, that raise little money and do not disclose their contributors electronically due to loopholes in the disclosure laws. The totals on this page include all party-affiliated PACs - local and statewide committees. In contrast, the pages that follow analyze contributions to the major statewide party committees only.

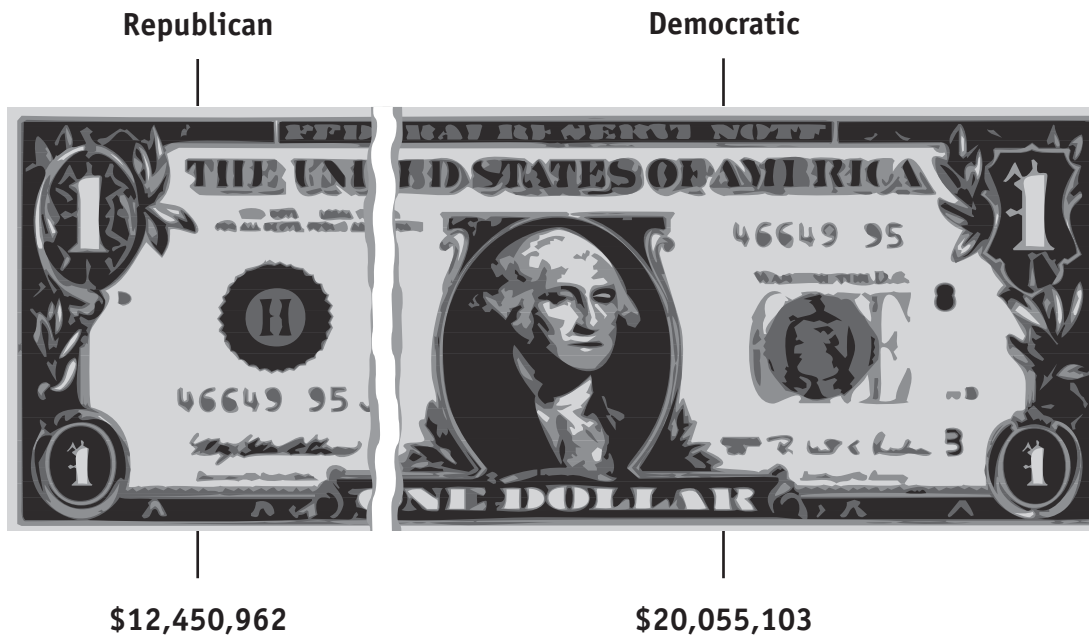
Total Raised By All Party-Affiliated PACs



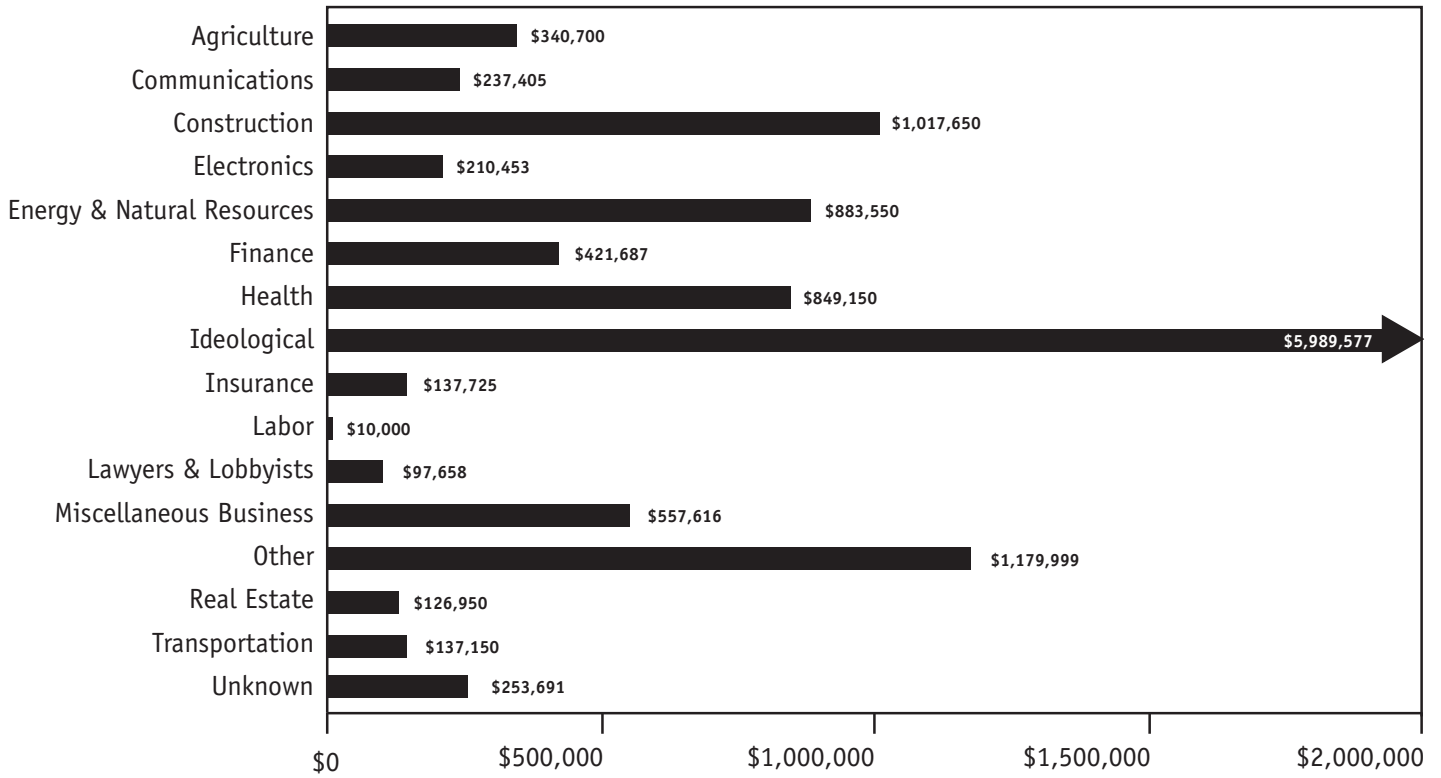
Note: Certain party PAC and county executive committees are the only Texas political organizations which are allowed to take contributions from corporations and labor unions.

Both major parties maintain a statewide organization: the Texas Republican Party and the Texas Democratic Party. These statewide party entities raise and spend the vast majority of party-affiliated contributions. Each party organization maintains two separate funds, one which can accept corporate and labor union donations (soft money), and one which can only accept non-corporate contributions from individuals, business partnerships and other PACs. This section analyzes contributions to both funds.

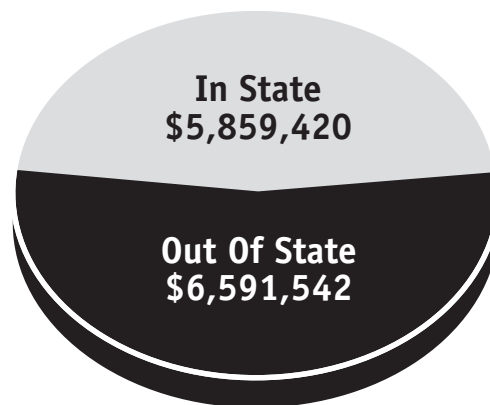
Total Amount Raised by Statewide Party Committees - 2002 Cycle



By Industry Sector



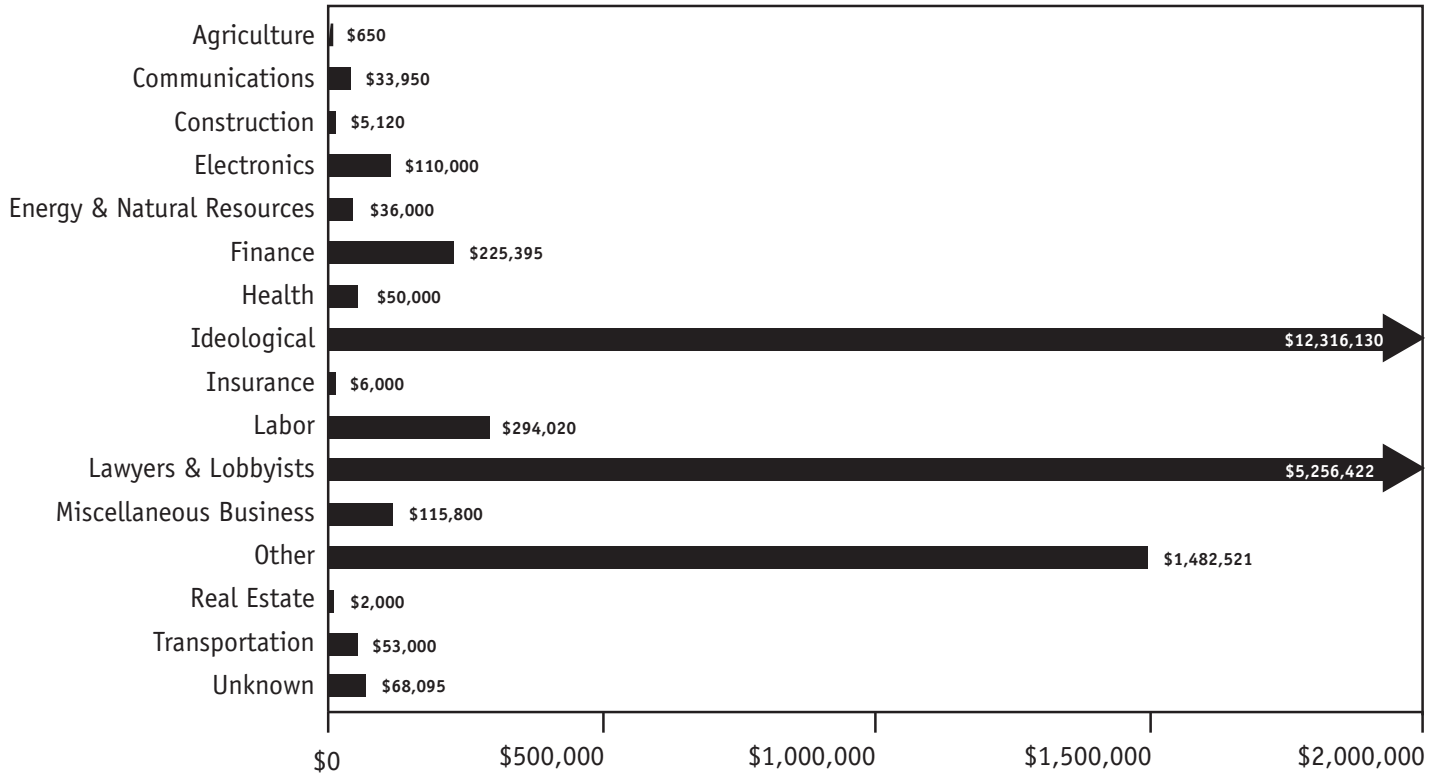
In-state v. Out-of-state Contributions



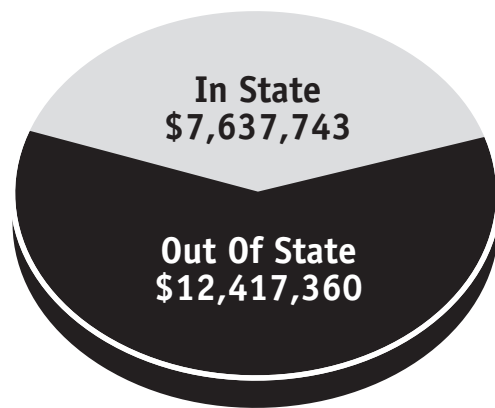
